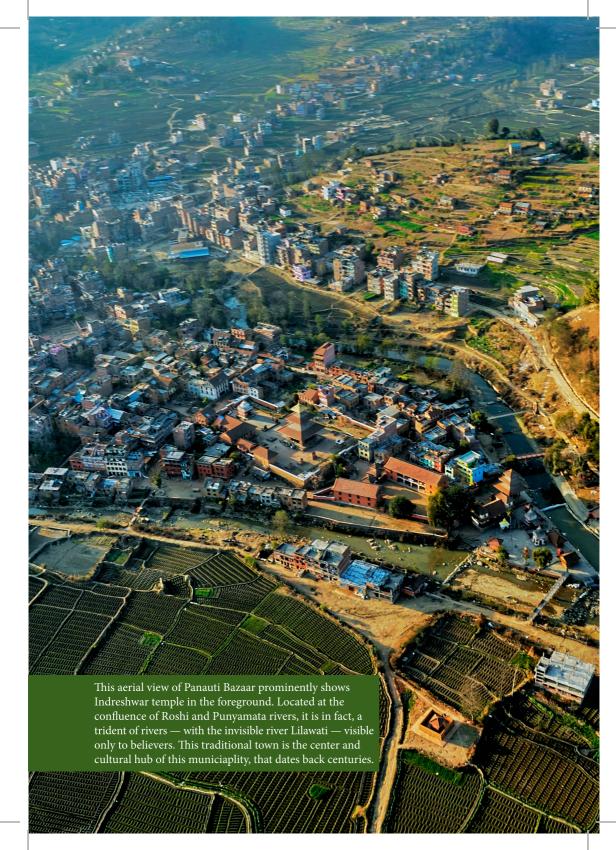
Panauti, our city, is renowned for its captivating tourist

# ABOUT PANAUTI

Learn about this ancient town that still preserves the cultural and historical treasures of yore – and immerse in the traditional experience of Nepal.

Panauti is one of the oldest towns in Nepal, consisting of many temples that are still present till this day dating back to the 15<sup>th</sup> Century or earlier. It has been debated that Panauti was founded by Ananda Malla (1274-1310AD), others believe that there is a golden scripture dated 1385, which is located within the Indreshwar temple stating that King Harisingh Dev founded the town.

Indreshwar is one of the largest and tallest pagoda style temples in Nepal. It was originally built over a 'linga' in 1294, making it the oldest surviving temple of Nepal. The roof struts embellishing the two lower stories of the temple are distinct Nepalese wood-carving and architecture. The upper section of the temple is hung with pots and pans, offerings from young married couples hoping for a happy and prosperous family life.

It is from this temple that the mystical third river of Panauti starts from leading to the Brahmayani temple across from the Tri Beni Ghats. The Indreshwar temple is kept in a very well maintained, walled in, compound which is managed by the Panauti Museum. Other than this temple, there is also the king's palace in Panauti's Durbar Square, which has yet to be excavated to a larger extent in order to reveal more about Panauti. Nevertheless, there are many artifacts and remnants such as stone taps, bricks, water wells and coins found among some of the excavated sections of the palace.

Although Panauti was founded independently, as time went on the influence of Bhaktapur (an ancient Newar town in the east corner from Kathmandu) increased and later became part of Bhaktapur up until the 18<sup>th</sup> Century. In 1763, King Prithvi Narayan Shah annexed Panauti to the larger and greater Nepal.

Panauti, consists of a variety of Buddhist and Hindu religious monuments, and is considered to be the area's most important medieval sites. For its unique ceremonies and celebration, Panauti holds a number of festivals reflecting the ancient tradition and ancient mythology. One of the most important is the three-day-long Panauti Jatra.

Panauti is one of the oldest cities of Nepal founded by Ananda Dev Malla during the medieval period of Nepal (1274-1310 CE). The typical town with beautiful temples is located 32 km southeast of the capital Kathmandu.

Potato, paddy, orange, and milk are the main agricultural products. Besides these people have taken small-scale industries, business, animal husbandry as the source of income. It occupies an area of 118 square kilometers. The Kshetri, Newars, Bramhin, Tamang, Mijar are the major ethnicity; the Newars predominate the city.

# Community Homestay

And during your stay, you can also take part in cooking several traditional Nepali meals, in a traditional Nepali style.



Apart from a historic setting of the town, great families are waiting to welcome you to their humble abodes as part of homestay program. If you are looking to know Nepal and Nepalis more intimately, this homestay program is just the thing for you to experience.

There can be no better way to get a deeper insight into the Nepali psyche and gain a better understanding of the local customs. But, keep in mind that you certainly will not get the kind of modern facilities you might be used to back home, or the amenities

that star hotels provide. You can most definitely look forward to being welcomed with genuine warmth and hospitality. All the homestays are run by the women for the women. Panauti Community Homestay is their initiative to empower the local women.

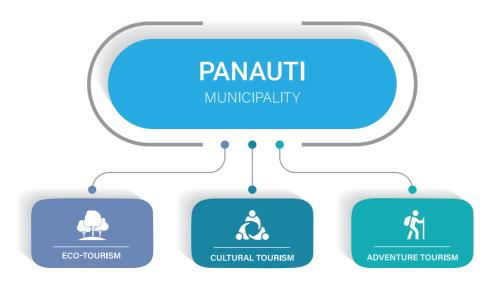


Panauti holds a number of festivals reflecting ancient tradition and mythology. One of the most important is the three-day-long Panauti Jatra, also known as **Chariot Festival**, which takes place every year in Panauti, at the end of the monsoon season. The festival usually begins on the tenth day of the bright fortnight during the month of Jestha (May–June). Celebrated for three days, this event is one of the major cultural attractions of the Panauti. During this festival, images of the gods (from the town's temples) are placed in a chariot and displayed around the city.

The following day of festival is called Mu-jatra, which means the main festival. On this day, many of the residents of Panauti will sacrifice male goats or ducks to the Gods, and many other will simply make an offering of food. The sixth day is the full moon day, which is also known as Panauti Punhi.

# culture & tradition

This day is the most favorable day for visiting the river and cleaning your body. Panauti is situated at the confluence of two main rivers, Rosi and Punyamata and people go dip in the confluence of the same. It is a popular belief that there is also a third river, Lilawati, that is visible only to seers. Due to the convergence of these three rivers, on festive occasions, large numbers of people come to this holy place to pay their respects, take a dip in the holy river and as well as visiting Indreswor Temple complex.



Panauti has a great possibility of adventure tourism such as paragliding and rock-climbing. Agricultural and eco-tourism are other strong potentialities of this area. Bird-watching, views of the great Himalayan range, view of natural resources including forests and rivers are the main attractions of this municipality. On top of it all, cultural tourism is the norm.









# THE FESTIVALS OF PANAUTI

The confluence of three rivers is an important holy site where every 12 years, a month-long fair is held known as Makar Mela, that is thronged by thousands.

Panauti celebrates several festivals (around 28) - some on a monthly basis, while some only once in 12 years. Panauti Jatra is a chariot festival or Jya Punhi, as they call it. It's is a three-day festivity that ends with deafeing cheers from the devotees at the bank of Punyamata Triveni Ghat and Makar Mela is where we come back to the holy confluence

of the two real and one mythological river – Roshi, Punyamata and Lilawati. This place has more than a dozen or so religious sites, dedicated to different gods and goddesses – one of the few places which always remain crowded with believers and worshippers. Once in every 12 years, the holy site of pilgrimage hosts the grand Makar Mela.

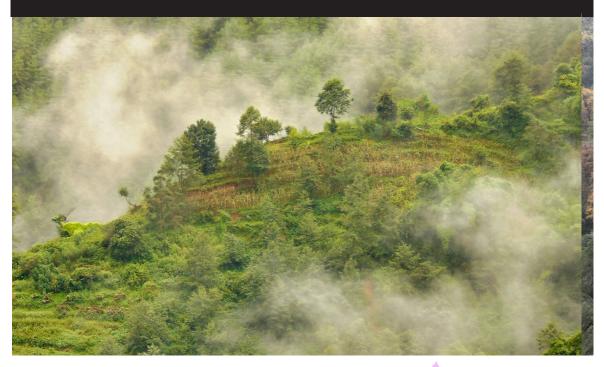

This airy hill, along to with the Gurdum-Mahābhārat Trail & a hike to the nearby Phulchoki makes for a perfect destination in Panauti. # WARD 3 KUSHĀDEVI

Ward 3 lies in the traditional trade route with Kathmandu and beyond. Today it commands majestic views — some of which are the best in the region. Do not bring just one or two cameras but bring in your entire kit - you do not know which scenery you will encounter on the next turn. You can spend time in one of the hills overlooking the mountains, take a walk in the forest, or just wander around town as you see fit. Try one of the local tea-shops where you'll get to mingle with the locals and learn a thing or two about the place.

# WARD 4 TAUKHĀL/THĀDOBĀTO



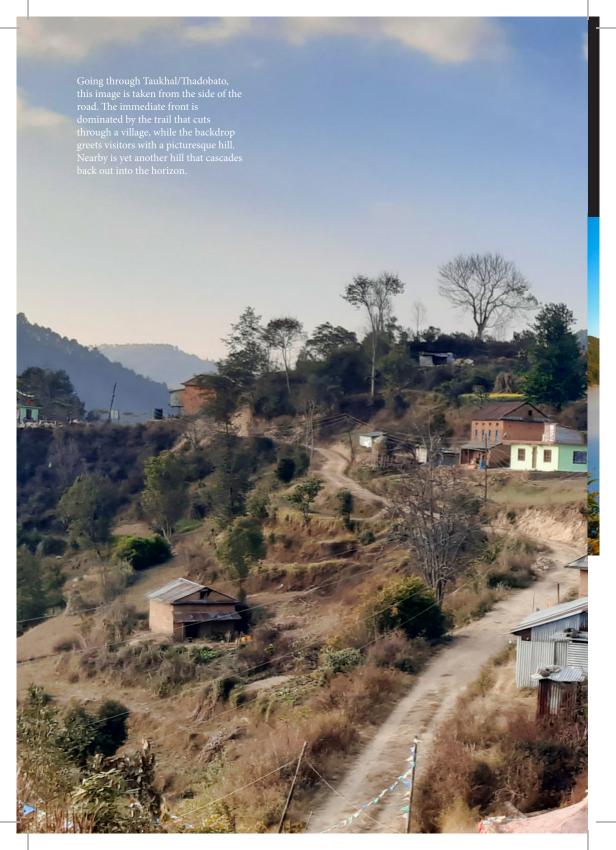

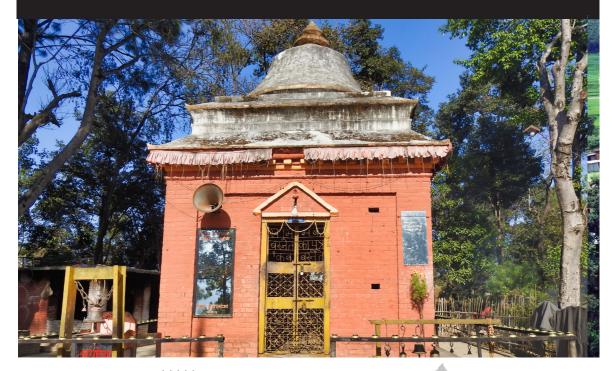

A little further is an extreme windy hill - aptly called Batase Danda - where batas means wind or air. Bring in your binoculars for astounding views of the Mahabharat Range, and also to grab a chance at bird-watching.

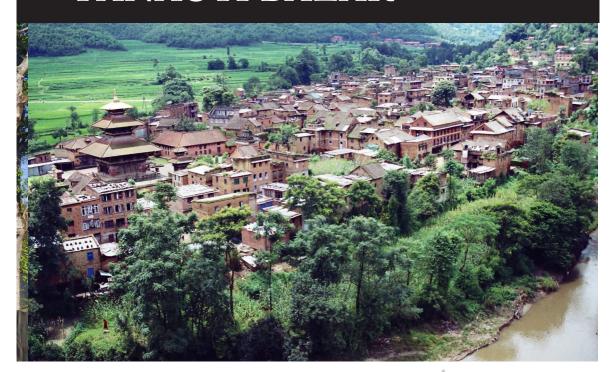

Ward 8, called Kharibot, is home to Shahid Park — a park established to commemorate martyrs of Nepal. Some of the early and most notable martyrs of Nepal are enshrined here. Located atop a hill, you can also enjoy the open scenery of the place when you're done seeing the martyrs. Additionally, you can bask in the greens of the forests and hills of this ward. Homestay is an excellent opportunity not to be missed here, as you will live in the house of the locals, tell them your story and listen to theirs, and even take part in cooking their food.



# WARD 9 SUNTHĀN

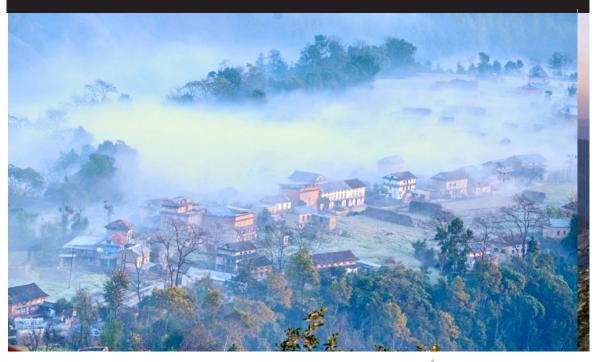

The scenic routes and beautiful villages are marks of this place. And if you're planning to stay overnight, you can choose from a hotel, a community homestay, or a resort - during your trip to Panauti.
